FEATURED SPEAKERS

Paul Douglas

is the chief meteorologist at WCCO-TV in Minneapolis. He is the author of two books, *Prairie Skies* and *Restless Skies*, and co-founded Digital Cyclone, which has developed weather applications for the wireless market. He received a Bachelor's degree in Meteorology from Pennsylvania State University.

John Hart, Ph. D.

Professor of Christian Ethics at Boston University, Dr. Hart has authored four books on environmental theology, including his latest, *Sacramental Commons*. He directed the Midwestern Catholic Bishops' Heartland Project, and was principal writer of their pastoral, *Strangers and Guests: Toward Community in the Heartland* (1980). Dr. Hart drafted Pope John Paul II's homily on land stewardship and was a Member of the Delegation of the International Indian Treaty Council to the U.N. International Human Rights Commission. His doctorate is from the Union Theological Seminary, NY.

Will Steger

Expedition leader, team member, educator, polar explorer, photographer, writer and lecturer, Will Steger is a voice for the understanding and preservation of the Arctic and the Earth. He led the first confirmed dogsled journey to the North Pole without re-supply (1986), the 1600 mile south-north traverse of Greenland, the historic 3,471 mile International Trans-Antarctica Expedition (the first dogsled traverse of Antarctica), and the International Arctic Project. Steger has received numerous honors, including the National Geographic Society's John Oliver La Gorce Medal.
